


I believe that God has great plans for the cities in this region. I believe the best is yet to come. And I am glad that you are with us.





City Church volunteers give back with "I Heart New Haven" Day

Hundreds of City Church members fanned out across New Haven Sunday to pick up trash, clear invasive plant species, paint and participate in other community service projects as part of their "I Heart New Haven" initiative.

At Edgewood Park, a band of volunteers from the church painted handrails on footbridges and cleared invasive plant species.

City Church members clad in bright blue T-shirts and armed with bottled water planned to stay three hours — or whatever was needed to get the job done. Their desire to help was tied to love of both New Haven and God. At the same time, City Church's Bridgeport congregation conducted an "I Heart Bridgeport" day of service. Across the two cities, 350 volunteers worked on 20 projects.

Friends of Edgewood Park President Willie Hoffman welcomed the volunteers and said his group more and more relies on such community service days from various organizations and student groups from area colleges and other schools because the city parks budget doesn't cover all the work that needs to be done.

This band of volunteers reported right after church.

"We just love being part of Christ Church and because of our faith in Christ," Justin Towart, an architect, said of he and his wife, Kelly, spending a beautiful Sunday afternoon helping. "He's (Jesus Christ) given so much to us that it's a joy to give back to the city we love. That's how God accepts us — free of charge."


His wife, Kelly, who works as a therapist to juvenile offenders, said, "We love the community we're part of. We want people to have a tangible encounter with Christ."
